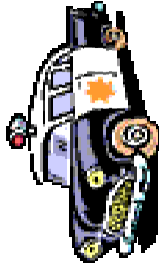

Explorers learn about the various aspects of a police officer's day to day duties through a combination of classroom presentations and role-play activities simulating the actual situations an officer would experience on the street.

Meetings are comprised of a combination of field trips, classroom presentations, guest speakers, and role-play activities. Explorers have visited:

PROGRAM GOAL

UNIFORMS

Part of being a police officer is maintaining a neat, professional appearance at all times while on duty. The purpose of this is what's known as "command presence." Uniforms identify us as officers and convey authority to the public, which assists us in performance of our duties.



Explorers are issued a full uniform, including long and short sleeve dress shirts, pants, tie, collar brass and name tag. These are inspected at the start of each meeting, and are expected to satisfy the standards of the Brockport Police Department.
